Don't be a tosser! Cigarettes tossed from vehicles can start bush fires. With the dry conditions at the moment, it's more important than ever to refrain from throwing your cigarette butts out the car window. You can report littering from a vehicle on 131 555 or online at epa.nsw.gov.au.

Noisy neighbours?

If your neighbour is causing noise that is annoying you, it's best to talk to them and try to resolve the issue. If you still can't resolve the issue, contact Council for assistance.

Noise restrictions are in place for the use of tools and other things which can disturb the neighbourhood. During these times, your noise should not be able to be heard inside someone else's residence. This applies to:

- → Power tools, pumps, lawn mowers not before 8 am or after 8 pm on any Saturday, Sunday or public holiday, or before 7 am or after 8 pm on any other day.
- → Musical instruments or electrically amplified sound equipment - not before 8 am or after midnight on Friday, Saturday or any day immediately before a public holiday, or before 8 am or after 10 pm on any other day.
- Motor vehicles (except when entering or leaving residential premises) - not before 8 am or after 8 pm on any Saturday, Sunday or public holiday, or before 7 am or after 8 pm on any other day.

What is a Neighbourhood Safer Place?

Neighbourhood Safer Places are a place of last resort during a bush fire. They are to be used when all other options in your bush fire survival plan can't be put into action safely.



Neighbourhood Safer Places in our Council area

- Monash Park, corner of Bolton and Mahonga Streets, Jerilderie.
- → Yamma Hall, 1334 Gilbert Road, Coleambally.
- Coleambally Community Club Car Park, Falcon Road, Coleambally.
- Darlington Point Sports Ground, King Street, Darlington Point.

You should note your Neighbourhood Safer Place in your bush fire survival plan before a bush fire occurs. You should also know how to get there, as well as alternate routes in case the road is blocked or too dangerous to drive on.

It can damage our health, animal health and the environment, nearby crops or land on other property.
