November has seen all of us extremely busy. Agriculturally harvest is in full swing - there are mixed reports as to the comparative yields - some crops better than others.

The Jerilderie community held the unveiling of the "Monash and The Bushranger" statue and story boards in Jerilderie on 17 November - a day of acknowledgement and entertainment that included piper bands, whip cracking and a re-enactment. My congratulations to the Monash Committee for their passion and commitment, ensuring the delivery of the project. Hosted and MC'd by Councillor Faith Bryce and supported by Councillor Robert Black, the unveiling was performed by Tony Fischer.

The Jerilderie Community also celebrated the official opening of the new netball changerooms on Saturday 23 November. A \$750,000 dollar grant through the NSW Government and supported by Murrumbidgee Council. What a huge investment in the Monash Park sporting facility. These interactions are frustrating, but we are hopeful that the ever evolving technology will enable a better, more comprehensive, coverage, with greater surety of delivery.

On 25 October, Council conducted a Citizenship Ceremony for Helette Ferreira and Gabriel Garcia, both of whom have settled in our LGA. We wish them success and happiness as they now live their lives as proud Australian citizens.

Council lay wreaths and was represented at Remembrance Day services across our Council LGA - paying our respects and never forgetting the price paid for peace in our lives is an honour. Across all age demographics eternal vigilance must be our ongoing expectation against challenging odds.
