### STAFF RETIREMENT—DENIS GELLE



Council has reluctantly accepted the resignation of Operations Manager, Denis Gelle, effective from 20 July 2018.

Denis' career started with Sydney Water, and for four years he worked mainly on water and sewage projects, including constructing a tunnel for a large water main under the Georges River. For the next 22 years he was employed by The Hills Council in their Engineering Department, carrying out most aspects of Local Government engineering, progressing to Subdivision Engineer where, for 10 years, Denis was responsible for approvals and supervision of construction for major subdivisions within the Shire.

On leaving The Hills Council, he ran his own property and development consultancy for 12 years, which provided a great insight into the complexities of private developer projects, including some major cases in the Land and Environment Court.

After 38 years in the work force, Denis decided a change of direction was needed, and managed a major caravan park on the Hawkesbury River for three years, virtually a seven day a week job, and managing up to four hundred guests on holiday weekends. The Park was a town within itself, with its own road network, water, sewage treatment and power reticulation.

Time for another change of direction, and this was when Denis applied for, and was successful in obtaining, the Jerilderie Shire Council's Design Engineer position. Denis commenced with Council on 12 September 2005. He is currently Operations Manager with Murrumbidgee Council. Denis has been integral in bringing together the works staff from both the former Murrumbidgee and Jerilderie Shire Councils. He has managed many major projects during his time with Council, including the refurbishment of the main CBD of Jerilderie, the creation of Memorial Park, including the relocation of the Cenotaph, and the construction of the Jerilderie Rural Fire Service Station, Wunnamurra Estate Stage 2 subdivision and the North Jerilderie sewerage system.

Now, after 53 years in the workforce, Denis has decided to resign and pursue other ventures (maybe including retirement).

Denis has enjoyed his time with Council, saying "Council has given me the opportunity of working with many talented people in the Jerilderie indoor and outdoor staff. The Coleambally and Darlington Point staff have provided me with much appreciated help and assistance in the new amalgamated Council".

We will be very sorry to lose Denis from our employ, but wish him well in his retirement.

### CHILDCARE INCREASED SUBSIDIES



Did you know from July 2, families could be up to \$1333 a year better off, but only if they update their details through myGov. The changes include rebates targeted towards families working, looking for work, studying or volunteering. Means tested rebates would also see low-income earners receiving increased subsidy for their child-care costs.

How average families will benefit:

- A family on \$50,000 – both parent/s working, with two children aged under 6 in long day care two days a week at \$100 a day will be around \$2,000 better off a year;
- A family on \$80,000 – both parent/s working, with two children aged under 6 in long day care three days a week at \$100 a day will be over \$3,000 better off a year;
- A family on \$150,000 – both parent/s working, with two children aged 6 and under in long daycare three days a week at \$100 a day will be more than \$1000 better off a year

## AUSTRALIAN RED CROSS, JERILDERIE BRANCH

Henry Dunant was the founder of Red Cross, because of the wounded left to die on the battlefields of Solferino, Italy in 1839. His catchcry was "all men are brothers". The Australian Red Cross is a volunteer based organisation, and it was founded in 1915 to respond to the needs of soldiers in WW1 and WW2, and now it is there to help people through disasters, operate Blood Banks and provide a wide range of community services. On 17 July 1915 the Jerilderie Branch of the Red Cross was officially formed. In 1939 there were 40 members. 1941 reports showed that the branch chose to "Adopt a POW", sending £1 weekly for each nominated Prisoner of War. The group sent £17 each week—in today's figures \$480 per week.

Jerilderie Red Cross has 10 members - a big difference to the early days. We have raffles for Mother's and Father's Day, concerts, Big Cake Day, our 100th birthday celebrations (in 2015) plus a Christmas Party. We plan to change our communications and be there for our community, plus any disasters that happen in our community and surrounding areas. We will be approaching the Hospital to see if we can have a morning tea or bbq every 2 months for residents, approach both schools to donate books, and explore other things. The Entertainment Night at the Sports Club is in aid of the Drought Relief Appeal, and proceeds will be sent direct to Dubbo Regional Office, a decision made at our June meeting.

New members are always welcome. Meetings are held on the second Thursday of the month, commencing 2.00pm at the Community Rooms of the Jerilderie Hospital.

## VALE SHAWN SMITH

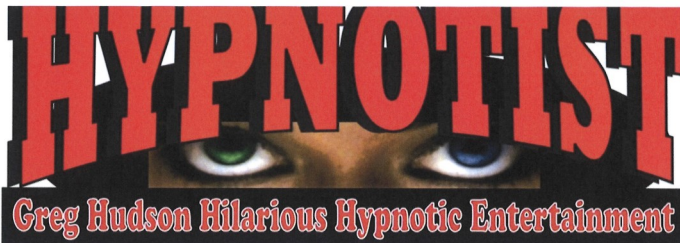


Murrumbidgee Council farewelled former workmate and friend Shawn Smith, who passed away on Saturday 2 June after losing a hard-fought battle with cancer.

Shawn became a Council staff member in early 2011. He worked with the Darlington Point outdoor staff as a labourer, and later tallyman. He also worked in parks and gardens in Coleambally.

Staff were inspired by Shawn's courage. After being diagnosed in late 2016, Shawn could not return to his full-time position. He refused to let his illness stop him from working and he spent a few hours a day in the Darlington Point office, helping in any way he could.

A church service for Shawn was held at St Paul's Anglican Church, Darlington Point on Friday 8 June. Councillors and staff attended the service as a mark of respect for a valued colleague and friend. Council and community extend sincere sympathy to his family.

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# AIDER Program

## Assistance for Infirm, Disabled and Elderly Residents

### A one-off free service to reduce bush fire hazards

#### AIDER SERVICES MAY INCLUDE

- ✓ Thinning vegetation.
- ✓ Removing leaves, sticks and fallen branches.
- ✓ Trimming branches from around and overhanging the home.
- ✓ Mowing or slashing long grass.
- ✓ Cleaning gutters.

An assessment of your property will be completed by NSW Rural Fire Service staff. Advice will be given about completing your Bush Fire Survival Plan. All works are completed by Rural Fire Service teams.

### What is AIDER?

AIDER is a once off **FREE** service, supporting residents to live safely and confidently in areas where bush fires may start. The property must be bush fire prone, meaning an area of land that can support a bush fire or is likely to be subject to bush fire attack.

### Who is eligible?

Aged residents and residents with disabling conditions who have limited domestic support from family, relatives, friends or other services.



**Are you prepared for a bush fire?**  
Aged and disabled people in the community may be at higher risk during a bush fire. The NSW Rural Fire Service recommends that you have a Bush Fire Survival Plan.
