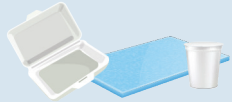
✓ Shredded paper

✓ Bicycle tyres, rope, strapping



Not in any bin



Community Recycling Centres
(Coleambally and Jerilderie Waste Depots)

Maximum container of 20 litres or 20 kilograms for each waste type. Drop-off for free.

Fire extinguishers • Fluorescent tubes and globes • Oils
Gas bottles • Batteries • Paint • Smoke detectors



YES Council Offices

Household batteries • Light globes
Mobile phones and accessories
Smoke alarms • Toner cartridges

Other options: Car batteries can be taken to the Coleambally or Jerilderie Men's Sheds.

Our Waste Depots accept: tyres, steel, fridges, green waste, demolition waste (fibro, roofing iron, concrete, bricks, builder's rubble, fencing wire, etc).

What goes in your green-lid Food Organics Garden Organics bin?

Your green lid FOGO bin is just for food scraps and garden waste.

✓ YES Put these in your green-lid bin

✓ Council supplied caddy liners
Aust Standard 4736-2006



✓ Bread, pasta and rice



✓ Fruit and vegetable scraps



✓ Eggs and dairy products



✓ Grass clippings, leaves, prunings and twigs



✓ Meat, seafood and bones



✓ Raw or cooked leftover or mouldy food

✗ NO Keep these out of your green-lid bin



Egg cartons • Fibre-based materials, such as bamboo, timber or cardboard packaging and cutlery, paper towels and serviettes • Food containers, packaging, cutlery (including compostable / biodegradable / bamboo) • Hair, fur and feathers • Large logs (>10 cm diameter) and treated wood • Nappies or wipes Paper, cardboard, baking paper • Pet waste, waste bags and kitty litter • Plastic bags and packaging (other than Council supplied caddy liners) • Sand • Shredded paper • Teabags and coffee pods Vacuum waste, washing machine or dryer lint • Visit murrumbidgee.nsw.gov.au for a full list of items

Kitchen caddy liners

We deliver 12 months' supply of caddy liners at a time (only liners with Australian Standard 4736-2006 can be used, in line with government requirements). If you run out, you can use your caddy without a liner and wash it in warm soapy water.

Did you know?

Our organic waste gets turned into professionally made compost at Worm Tech's Composting Facility at Carrathool. This high grade compost is used by farmers to grow produce for Australia and the world.

What goes in your yellow-lid Recycling bin?

Please rinse items first.

✓ YES Put these in your yellow-lid bin



✓ Glass bottles and jars



✓ Paper and cardboard
(no smaller than a business card)



✓ Rigid plastics
Put lids in separately



✓ Steel cans and containers



✓ Aluminium trays, cans and foil (scrunched up to the size of an orange)

✗ NO Keep these out of your yellow-lid bin



Coffee or milkshake cups
Cookware, crockery, water or wine glasses • Hoses or dripper lines • Mirrors • Paper that is waxed, food stained, or coated with plastic or aluminium
Shredded paper • Soft plastics and plastic bags

Did you know?

Keeping the life cycle of products going and keeping them out of landfill has many benefits. Not only are we using resources more efficiently, but we are also ensuring our waste does not become a problem for future generations to deal with.

Annual Kerbside Collections – every Spring

Maximum: 2 cubic metres per household = 6x4 foot trailer
(individual items must be able to be lifted by 2 people)

Bulky green waste

Sawn timber offcuts
Tree branches tied in bundles up to 300 mm in diameter (max 75 mm diameter and 1.5 m long)
